**Guinea and Sierra Leone:** The National Coordination of TLP-Guinea calls for calm and restraint.

The National Coordination of Turn the Page (TLP Guinea) is deeply concerned by the recent incidents between Guinean and Sierra Leonean armed forces at the border in the Koudaya district, part of the Sandeniah sub-prefecture in Faranah, between the two countries, on February 22-23, 2026. We call on the authorities of both sovereign states to exercise restraint and avoid any action that could escalate the situation.

On behalf of Guinean Civil Society, the National Coordination of Turn the Page reiterates that Guinea and Sierra Leone share a rich history, a common culture, and close ties that must be preserved by both governments. Border disputes must be resolved through dialogue and negotiation, with mutual respect and in accordance with the sovereignty of both nations. We urge the Guinean and Sierra Leonean governments to engage in frank and constructive diplomatic discussions to find a peaceful and lasting solution to this conflict.

The stability and security of our sub-region are essential for the economic and social development of our two nations. We are confident that wisdom and responsibility will prevail, and that our two states will find a way to resolve this dispute as soon as possible, in the interest of both our peoples.
